Janessa Dumas accomplished some incredible things as Manitoba's Champion Child in 2024.

As the first Champion from a remote First

Nations community, she became a powerful voice for the 140,000 kids who rely on HSC Children's

Hospital every year, of whom around 60 per cent are Indigenous.

Janessa shared her story and the amazing work and research being done in Manitoba at more than 20 events. She inspired countless donors while also running her own fundraiser to support the Nephrology Clinic and Hemodialysis Unit. Plus, she represented HSC Children's with fellow Champions from across North America in Orlando for Children's Hospital Week.

Her impact has been felt throughout the province and beyond, and she was even awarded a King Charles III Coronation Medal for her dedication.

LIKE FATHER, LIKE DAUGHTER

When Haylie was born, she struggled to breathe and was rushed to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit at HSC Children's Hospital. Thankfully, a specialist at Children's Hospital noticed Haylie's father has a congenital disorder called Hirschsprung's Disease and soon confirmed Haylie has the same condition and could start treatment.

Since her diagnosis, she has had 30 surgical procedures and spent more than 200 nights in hospital. After trying many different treatments, in early 2024, the surgical team put in an ostomy bag to divert waste from her affected intestines—and now Haylie is thriving.

Haylie's parents are grateful for the amazing care their family continues to receive at the hospital and research that helps children with illnesses like this.

YOUR GENEROSITY IS ALREADY SAVING LIVES

The Better Futures campaign surpassed all expectations. Thanks to our generous donors we exceeded the goal and over 90 per cent of the funds have been actioned, with tangible impacts already seen and felt by the families and kids who need care.

A big thank you to the Province of Manitoba for investing \$25 million into kids' health, bringing our campaign impact to an astounding \$112 million. The provincial funding supports initiatives like a modernized emergency department, new operating rooms, and redevelopment of the pediatric hemodialysis unit.

The 6,000 kids who need cardiac care at HSC Children's Hospital each year can now be helped with specialized equipment and access to state-of-the-art spaces and care through the new Travis Price Children's Heart Centre,


YOU GAVE CRITICAL ENHANCEMENTS TO EMERGENCY CARE

Our Emergency Department—the only one with specialized care for infants and children in Manitoba—sees 50,000+ kids annually but was designed for just 36,000 annual visits. Planned improvements will enhance the overall patient and staff experience, improve patient flow and safety, and equip the department with state-of-the-art medical equipment. It will also fund emergency research programs and a national knowledge mobilization network.

YOU GAVE SUPPORT FOR A CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE FOR KIDS' KIDNEY HEALTH

Over 1,000 kids need kidney care at our hospital, but the facility requires major improvements. Your ongoing generosity will support life-saving treatments like dialysis, transplants, and kidney biopsies.

A Manitoba tradition, the Teddy Bears' Picnic gives kids a chance to learn what happens in a hospital or research setting so they feel more comfortable getting the care they need. Made possible by generous sponsors and 1,000+ volunteers, the event brought the community together for an unforgettable day of family fun and celebration of the Better Futures campaign. Attendance was over 35,000 people and 1,500+ teddy bear patients were treated in the Dr. Goodbear Clinic, and \$261,527 was raised!

YOU GAVE SUPPORT TO RECONCILIATION ACTIONS

As we gather, work, and care for each other on Treaty 1 land and serve children who rely on HSC Children's Hospital from First Nations, Métis, and Inuit communities, the Foundation's ongoing commitment to ReconciliACTION is important to our staff, the hospital healthcare teams and the families we serve.

The Foundation is committed to working alongside Indigenous communities to listen, learn, and drive meaningful, lasting change. While we've made progress, there's still much more to be done on this critical journey.

INTEGRATING INDIGENOUS CULTURES, HISTORIES AND TRADITIONS

...IN OUR SPACES

Up to 60 per cent of children using the hospital are from Indigenous communities, many living with conditions like diabetes and some cancers that are more common among Indigenous kids and require ongoing hospital care.

Recognizing the value of Indigenous healing practices—and making them available for Indigenous patients where requested—is the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada's Call to Action 22.

Your donations will support a new Indigenous Community Healing Space at HSC Children's Hospital.

"The creation of the Indigenous Community Healing Space will foster equitable care while embracing Indigenous cultures and be a place where children and their families can feel safe, have ceremony and traditional medicine while recognizing themselves and their culture within the healthcare environment."

 Dr. Melanie Morris, the first Métis pediatric surgeon in Canada, who was appointed as the first lead of Indigenous Health at HSC Children's in 2019.



The 2,000-sq-ft space is designed to be a place where children and families feel safe, connect with each other and nurture their whole selves while away from their home communities and cultural supports.

The Indigenous Community Healing Space will feature:

- design elements that reflect Indigenous culture, spirituality and worldview
- space for traditional Indigenous ceremonies, including smudging
- a place for Indigenous Elders, healers, and Knowledge Keepers to support families in care
- · a library space for Indigenous children's books



Consultation meetings were held in 2024 for guidance from First Nations, Metis and Inuit leaders, Elders, Knowledge Keepers and other Indigenous community members and leaders in our medical community. To build a more meaningful framework and design options, additional fundraising is still needed but demolition of the current space will begin in Fall 2025.

...IN OUR BRAND

We worked with Indigenous graphic artist Leticia Spence, and with the guidance of the Foundation's Indigenous

Advisory Circle, to develop meaningful graphics that fit the light, fun, and supportive tone for all kids who need care at HSC Children's Hospital. Brand graphics represent First Nations, Métis, and Inuit cultures, including beading-style florals (buttercup, wild rose, fireweed blossom, and arctic cotton), traditional medicines (sage, tobacco, cedar, and sweetgrass), and other elements, like winding vines with

mouse tracks and seeds.

Indigenous Advisory Circle members provide valuable input and feedback on Foundation events and fundraising initiatives.

We thank Rebecca Chartrand, Chair, and Heather Berthelette, Vice Chair, who sat on Foundation Board providing direction and feedback with an Indigenous lens.

This support guides our ongoing work to support kids from Manitoba, Northwestern Ontario and Nunavut who receive care at Manitoba's only Children's Hospital.





...AT OUR EVENTS

Attendees at the 35th annual Teddy Bears' Picnic listened to the powerful rhythms of Indigenous drummers, heard special messages from Indigenous leaders in the province and enjoyed on-stage entertainment from First Nations dancers, Inuit throat singers, and Métis fiddlers. Elders also offered teachings in a teepee throughout the day.
